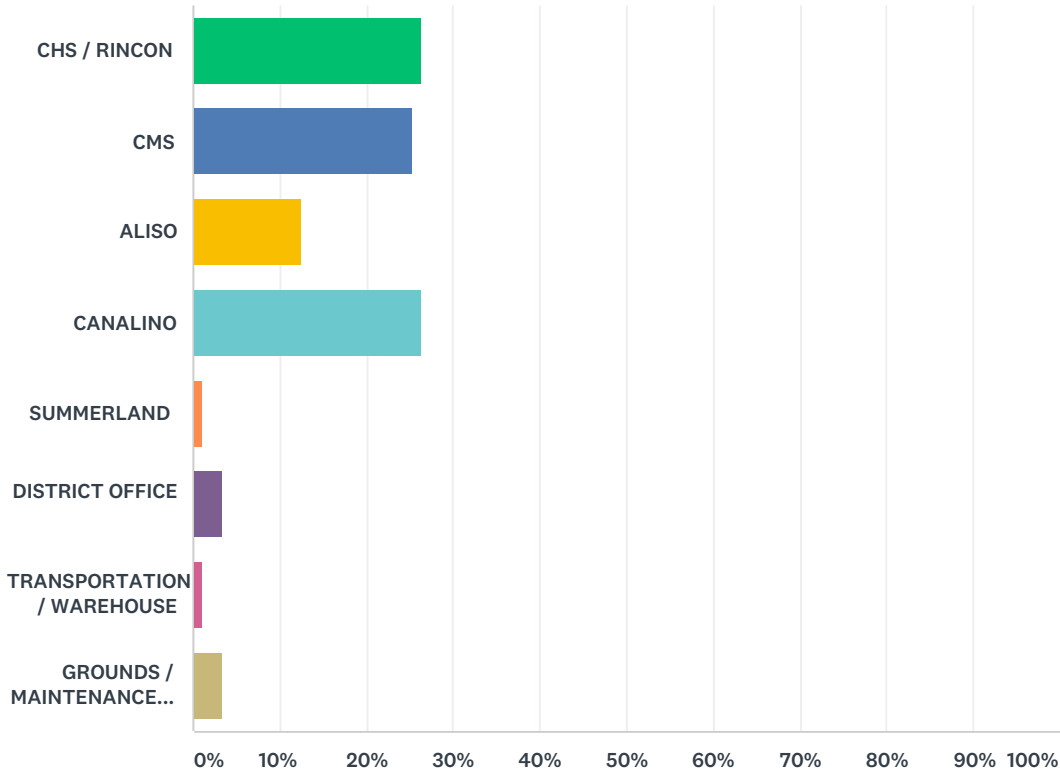

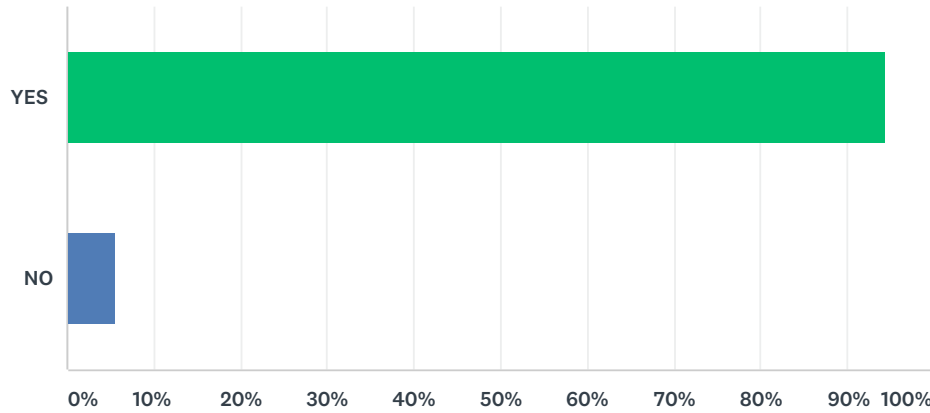

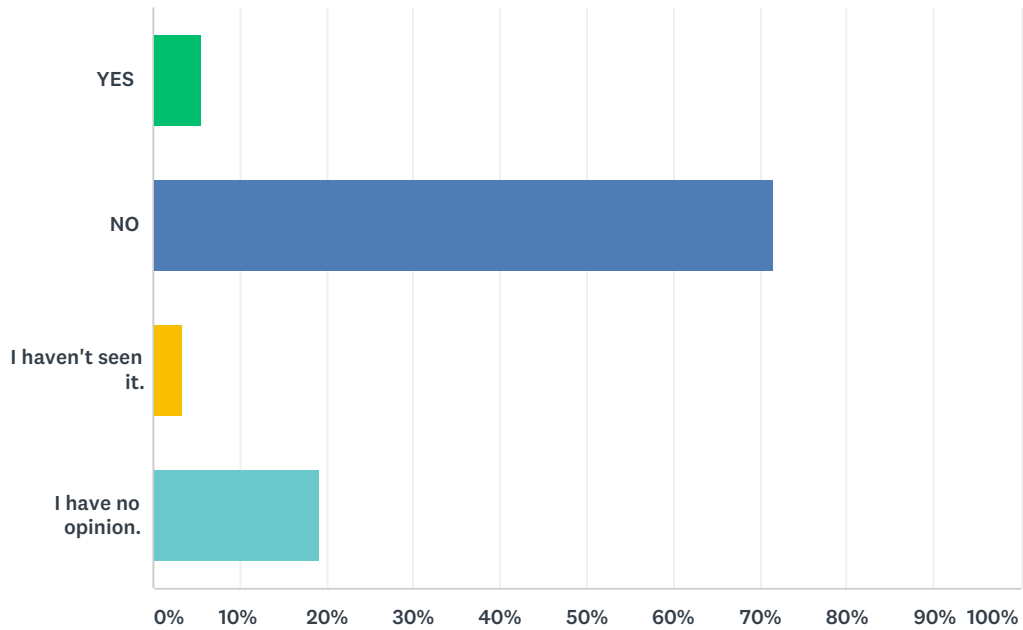

### Q3 If so, do you believe the photo supported the mission of the CUSD?

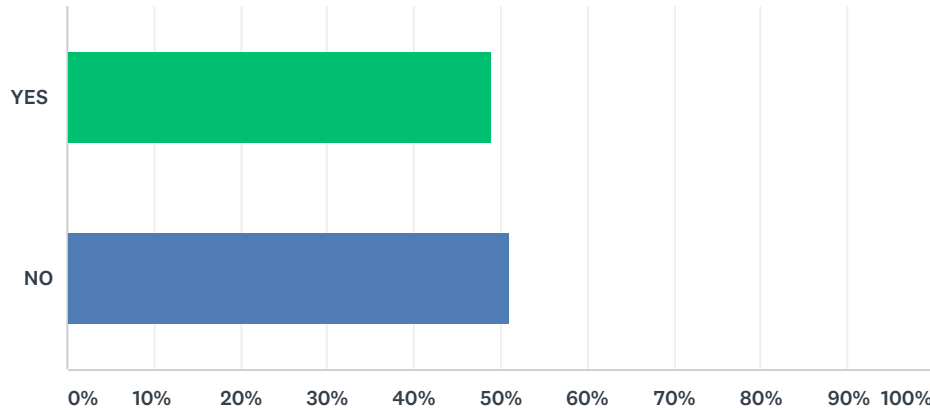

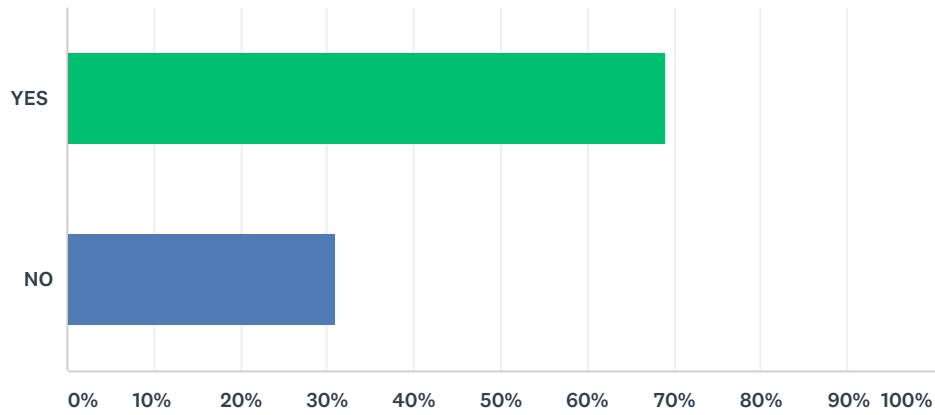

### Q5 Are you aware that government agencies have established 'buffer-zones' between cannabis cultivation and CUSD school-sites and facilities?

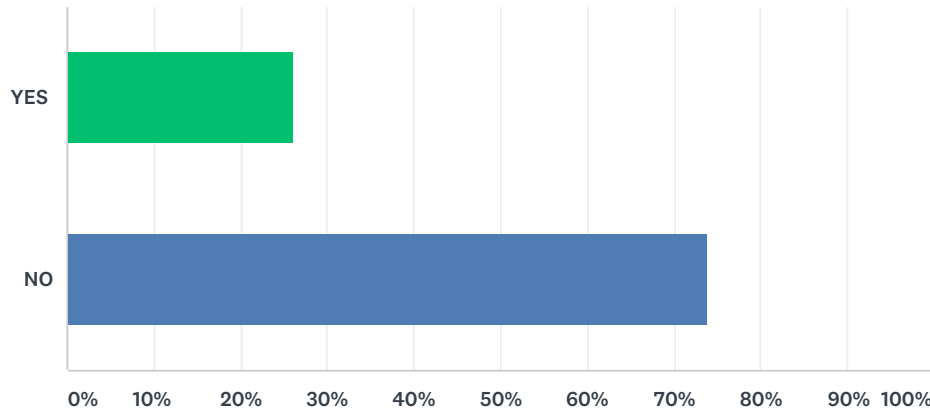

### Q6 Are you aware of the specific distance/s established for these 'buffer-zones' ?

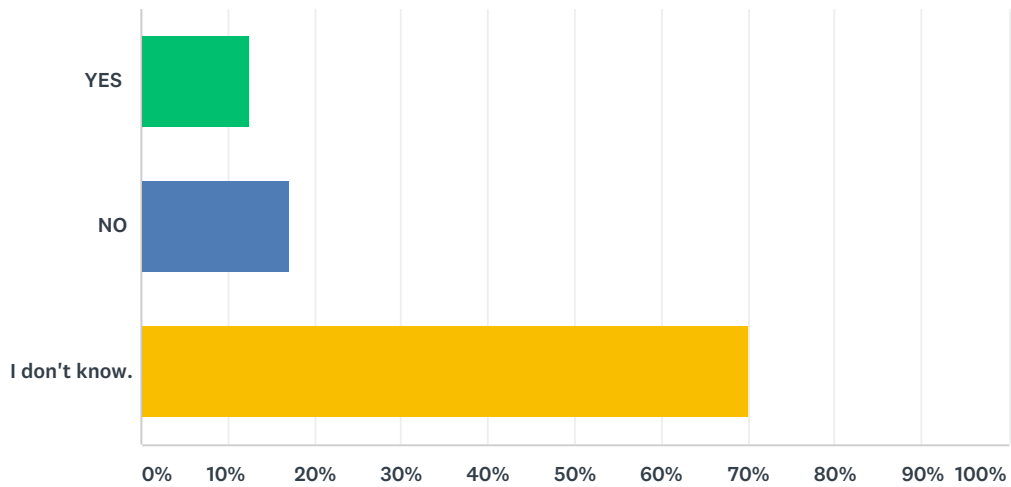

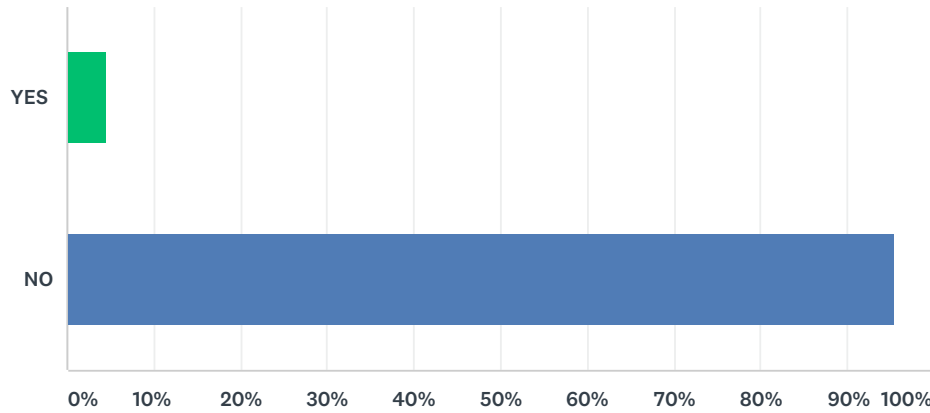

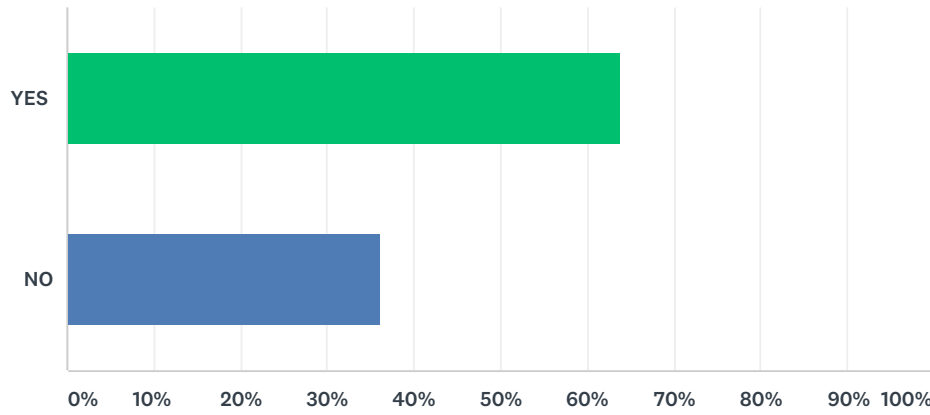

## Q12 Were your observations / concerns positively received?

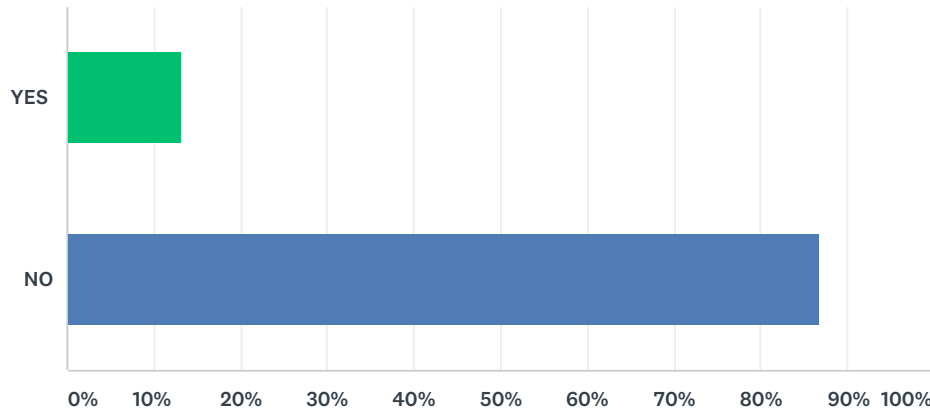

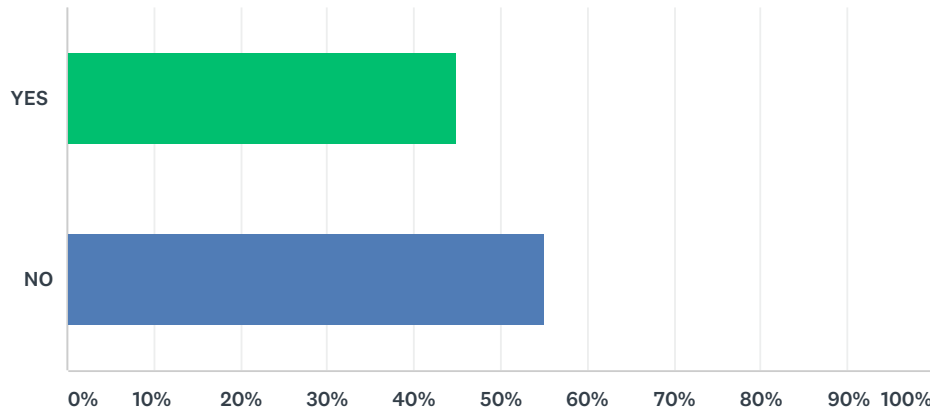

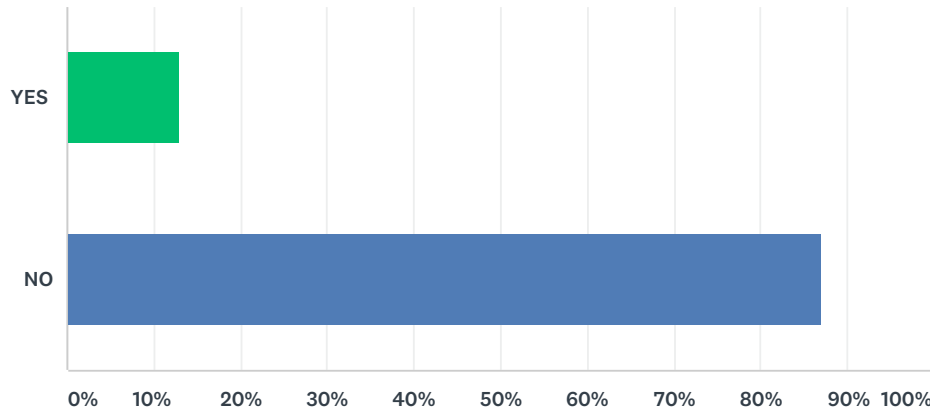

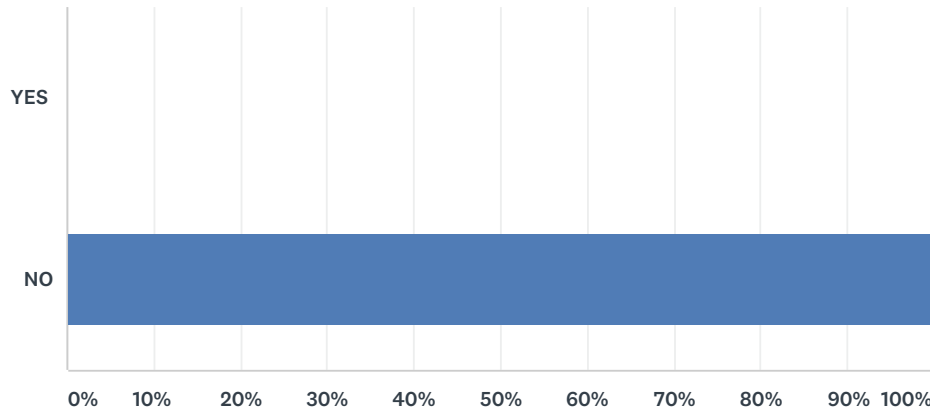

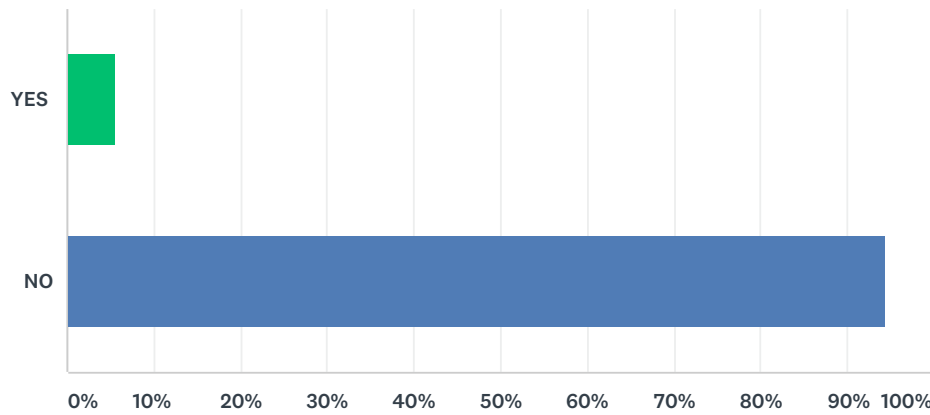

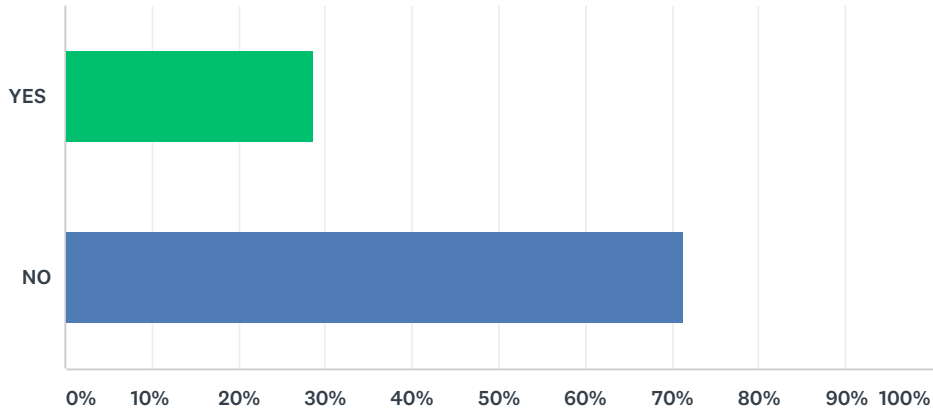

### Q32 Are you aware that the legalization of recreational cannabis cultivation (in California) is in conflict with federal statutes governing the topic?

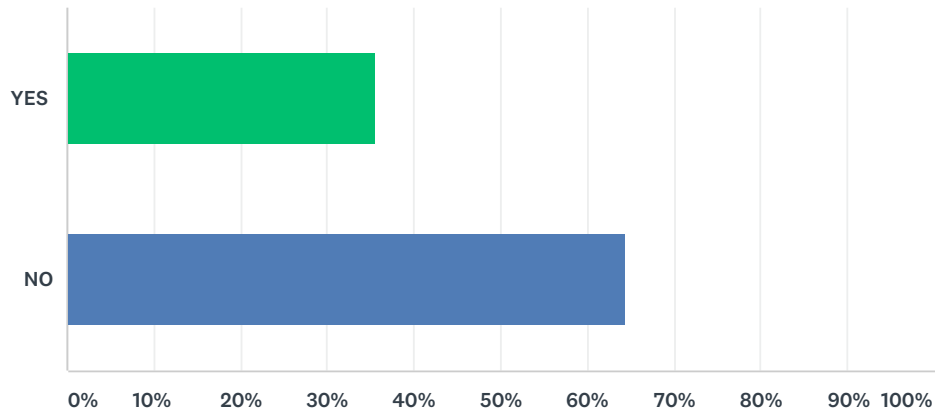
